In states where public employees have a strong union, wages and benefits are better because we can bargain from a position of strength.

State & Higher Ed

\$421.51 per month. That's the extra money in your pocket each month (on average) thanks to the healthcare benefits negotiated in our contract.

\$431 per month. That's the extra money in your retirement account each month (on average) thanks to our contract.

Representation. Union members are there for each other when we need it most, like when facing false accusations or wrongful termination. Stewards at worksites around the state, and the Member Resource Center at SEIU offices, are there for you.

Local Government

\$440 per month. That's the extra money you're paid per month (on average) compared to non-union local government workers throughout the country.

10 days. The number of vacation days accrued (on average) by our contracts in the first year of employment (accrual amount increases over time).

7.8 hours. The hours of sick pay (on average) our contracts accrue for each month worked.
